The New Year brings new changes

ADWAS has received 2 new grants for the Transitional Housing Program (THP.) Napal Tesfai and Jeniffer Mendoza-Morales share 2 full time positions (each one splits ½ time Transitional Housing Advocacy and ½ Independent Living Skills Training.) Additionally, Ingrid Tidblom is now in the position of providing community education/outreach. The new position will require her to go to 4 counties in Washington to provide several "living room project" events and to raise awareness about sexual and domestic violence in the Deaf and Deaf-Blind communities. Jena Floyd has been hired to replace her in her former position as a Community Advocate. Crystal Green has taken on coordinating the local crisis line volunteers and Kate Spencer has been hired to replace Crystal in answering the national hotline calls.

Due to the economy, funding to ADWAS for social justice work was not renewed this year. Because of this, Cathy Hoog, the second longest working ADWAS employee left the organization on December 31st after 22 years of service to the Deaf and Deaf-Blind community. Her presence and her knowledge will be greatly missed.
