Men's Engagement Coordinator - New Project Announcement

We are proud to announce a project new to ADWAS. Beginning October 1st, ADWAS received funding from the Office of Violence against Women allowing ADWAS to develop and implement a prevention campaign directed toward Deaf men. As many of you know, ADWAS has served male victims since it opened in 1986 and we continue to provide services to men today. Now, in addition to serving male survivors of violence, we will create a group of Deaf male allies who will actively work with other Deaf men to increase their understanding of violence against women; create a more positive environment in the Deaf community for victims; increase Deaf men's awareness of domestic and sexual violence and the impact violence has on individual victims/ survivors, children, and the community as a whole.

Hotline Advocate Position
